# OREGON CRIMINAL JUSTICE COMMISSION GRANT

- Third Biennium of funding.
- Second year of the Biennium Three.
  - Semi Annual Program Report.
  - · Annual Victim's Services Report.
  - · Fourth Quarter Financial Report.
- Deschutes County JRI Program.
  - · Specialized Caseload.
  - Cognitive Behavioral Treatment (MRT / Moving On).
  - · Sober Housing/Transitional Housing.
  - · Recovery Mentors.
  - Alcohol and Drug Treatment.

## **GOALS OF JRI**

- Reduce Recidivism.
- Reduce Prison Utilization.
- Increase Public Safety.
- Hold Offenders Accountable.
- All focused on Drug, Property, and Driving offenders.

# MAJOR ACCOMPLISHMENTS FOR OUR JRI PROGRAM

- Deschutes County Community Justice MRT program received a Highly Satisfactory Score on it first Correctional Program Checklist Assessment (CPC).
  - Only 7% of programs receive this highly satisfactory score.
- We hired a second MRT facilitator and are currently running 7 MRT groups each week. Moving On to be implemented September 1 (gender-specific).
  - 77 Offenders active in MRT as of July 1, 2018.
  - 46 Offenders successfully completed the program in the past year, and 31 of those are JRI offenders.
- Incorporation of evidence-based practices such as Carey Guides and BITS into offender supervision model.

### PROGRAM CHALLENGES


- · Drug and Alcohol Treatment Provider.
  - Struggling to provide services that meet evidence-based standards. Failed third CPC in October of 2017.
  - · Joint action plan with DOC, Provider, and our office.
  - · Working closely together to help them pass CPC in November.
- Progress.
  - · Referral Packet Process and Assessment.
  - · Group Room Expansion.
  - University of Cincinnati Substance Abuse Curriculum.
  - · Joint Quality Assurance.
    - · Group Observations.
    - · Case File Reviews.


# ACCOMPLISHMENT WITH OUR COMMUNITY PARTNERS

- Recovery Mentors
  - · 2500 Contacts with active client in last six months
  - · 670 After Care Contacts with clients in last six months.
  - · 28 Clients who had a mentor successfully completed treatment.
- Sober Housing
  - 80 Offenders received sober housing assistance, 54 of those specifically JRI.
  - 16 Offenders transitioned from sober housing into self-sufficient housing of some kind.
- Transitional Housing
  - Bl Partnership
    - Three Case Managed Beds.
    - 90 Days Generally
    - We had Seven offenders utilize our case managed beds at the Bethlehem Inn.
      - Four transitioned to more stable housing arrangements.
      - All seven secured stable employment.

# Peschutes County Three Year recidivism rates won't be available for our JRI participants until end of 2019. One Year recidivism rates. Blue: Arrest Any New Crime: Down 7% from last comparison. Mustard: Conviction New Misdemeanor or Felony: Down 2% from last comparison. Green: New Incarceration (New Felony): Up 3% from last comparison.







#### OTHER REDUCTIONS IN PRISON UTILIZATION

- Past six months;
  - · 60 Downward Departure offenders.
  - · 16 Alternative Incarceration Program offenders.
  - · 15 Short Term Transitional Leave offenders.
- · Partnership with District Attorney.
  - 14 Safe Screens and 10 Defendant Assessment Reports.
  - · Of the ten, five not sent to prison and three are still pending.

## **EXCITING DEVELOPMENTS FOR JRI PROGRAM**

- Moving On Curriculum.
  - Program development is underway to replace MRT with Moving On for all females receiving departmental cognitive based interventions.
  - Gender specific curriculum that aims not only at reducing criminal behavior but also increasing the health and well-being of women, their families, and the community.
- Evidence-based Practices Training and Implementation Committee.
  - Motivational Interviewing, Evidence-based Case Planning, Carey Guides, BIT.
