Passage of the levy would help Bend-La Pine Schools prepare students for lifelong learning and career success. The District serves over 17,000 students.

The District is unable to fully fund student focused programs and services with revenues received under the state funding model. This proposed 5-year local option levy would allow the District to bridge the funding gap and dedicate resources for the following:

- Strengthening and adding Career Technical Education pathways
- Protecting and maintaining class sizes
- Recruiting and retaining teachers and support staff
- Increasing advanced academic offerings for students
- Improving support systems for struggling students
- Enhancing elective offerings in music, art, technology, business, world languages

The levy would establish a tax rate of \$1.00 per \$1,000 of assessed property value. The estimated cost for a home with a median assessed value of \$238,750 is \$239 a year.

The levy would raise an estimated:

\$21,200,000 in 2024-25

\$21,836,000 in 2025-26

\$22,491,000 in 2026-27

\$23,165,000 in 2027-28

\$23,860,000 in 2028-29

The total raised over 5 years is estimated at \$112,552,000.
